

# OPENING CHINA'S ANCIENT KINGDOMS to the WEST

Chinese civilization originated in regional centres along both the Yellow River and the Yangtze River valleys during the Neolithic era, and for centuries Chinese culture, literature and philosophy have flourished, with each Kingdom and Dynasty adding to its collective knowledge and cultural heritage. Yet China was an insular country, allowing only glimpses of cultural richness to the outside world via the Silk Road, which stoked the European's imagination of exotic lands in the East. A mysterious land, one which Napoleon referred to as "a sleeping giant that would change the world when awoken," the country finally lifted its shroud in 1972. The reopening of China and the introduction of its ancient traditions to the Western world, which vaulted it into its current progressive nation status, has been and continues to be a spectacular transformation of the most populous, perhaps most culturally idiosyncratic nation on Earth.

## Dr. Jian Wang, Guest Speaker



Jian "Jay" Wang, Ph.D., Director of the USC Center on Public Diplomacy, brings us his personal perspective on the globalization of China. A native of Shanghai, Dr. Wang has authored, coauthored

and edited several books and articles on communication strategy and public diplomacy with a focus on this emerging giant, including his latest book, Shaping China's Global Imagination: Soft Power and Nation Branding at the World Expo. Dr. Wang is an Associate Professor at the USC Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism and previously taught at Purdue University and the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He has lectured at Beijing University, Shanghai Jiao Tong University and Nánjing University and has spoken about his research on China Central Television. He earned his B.A. from Beijing University, M.A. from the University of Minnesota and Ph.D. from the University of Iowa.


# Beijing, China

The former imperial city of Mongol, Ming and Manchu emperors, Beijing is one of China's ancient citadels. Rich in historical sites and cultural relics, this dynamic city of more than 12 million people is the cultural and spiritual heart of the country and the ideal place from which to begin tracing the fascinating narrative of ancient China.

Walk through immense and historic Tiananmen Square, the world's largest public square, site of the mausoleum of modern China's founder, Mao Zedong.

Visit the ceremonial halls, royal apartments, gardens and temples of the Imperial Palace in the mystical Forbidden City, residence of Ming and Qing dynasty emperors for almost 500 years and a UNESCO World Heritage site.

The beautifully landscaped Summer Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage site, was the retreat of 19<sup>th</sup>-century Empress Dowager Cixi. Walk through Cixi's private apartments filled with jewel-encrusted furniture, and see her ornate Marble Boat. Then cruise by private boat across Kunming Lake's tranquil waters.

Visit the magnificent Great Wall of China, the symbol of imperial grandeur since 500 B.C., constructed over the course of 2000 years. This imposing fortification once spanned more than 5600 kilometres. Walk along this UNESCO World Heritage site and see sweeping views of the scenic northern plains and valleys.

Tour another extraordinary UNESCO World Heritage site, the Temple of Heaven, and its magnificent complex of religious buildings.

### Xi'an

Modern Xi'an was China's thriving capital of emperors, courtesans, monks, merchants and soldiers for 11 dynasties; a place where many of the world's great religions coexisted and the fabled launching point of the Silk Road, where camel caravans brought goods from the Eurasian continent and sent Chinese influence out to the world. From Xi'an's distinctive, triple-eaved Bell and Drum Towers, watchmen once signalled dawn and dusk

with a bell and a drum.

Visit the amazing 20th-century archaeological find and UNESCO World Heritage site: the famous life-size Terra Cotta Warriors—no two alike—have guarded the still-unopened tomb of China's first emperor, Qin Shihuang, for more than 2000 years. Tour the exquisite Yangling Imperial Tomb, where thousands of captivating figurines excavated from the 2100-year-old tomb of



Emperor Liu Qi capture the essence of daily life during the Han Dynasty, a high point in Chinese history, when culture and the arts flourished as never before.

# Chongqing

Embark on your cruise down the fabled Yangtze River in the picturesque mountain city of Chongqing, which clings to the cliffs at the confluence of the Yangtze and Jialing rivers and served as a base for the famous Flying Tigers during World War II.

# Grand Yangtze Cruise Three Gorges/Three Lesser Gorges/ Three Gorges Dam

This exclusively chartered cruise stops in ports Westerners rarely visit and showcases the grandeur of one of China's greatest natural wonders, the Three Gorges. Pass through Qutang Gorge, Wu Gorge and the spectacular Xiling Gorge. Aboard excursion boats, travel up the Daning River through the majestic scenery of the Three Lesser Gorges.

Visit the massive Three Gorges Dam, the largest water conservancy project ever undertaken by man. Considered a key to China's modernization, it is the world's largest hydroelectric dam, 2335 metres wide and 185 metres high.


### Wuhan

once a possession of the Wu Kingdom in the Three Kingdoms Period. The city's cultural legacy blends seamlessly into its modern role as a thriving transportation hub.

Just beyond the city, visit the private retreat residence of Chairman Mao, the "Home of the White Clouds and Yellow Cranes." It was here amidst the quiet ambiance of bamboo tree-lined footpaths, dense groves and flying songbirds, Chairman Mao conducted daily national affairs several times a year and hosted an audience with celebrities and foreign dignitaries.

# **Huangshan®**

Ascend 975 metres by modern cable car through a plethora of subtropical flora and wildlife to the peak of UNESCO World Heritage-designated Yellow Mountain for dramatic panoramic views that have inspired centuries of Chinese artists and poets. The fascinating topography of granite peaks, emerging clouds and unique rock formations has been a source of mythology throughout the centuries. This historical centre of booming tea trade produces almost 30 varieties of teas.

# Nánjing

Beautiful Nánjing, settled near the lower Yangtze River, has twice served as China's capital, first in the early years of the Ming dynasty (1368–1644) and then as the capital of the Republic of China in the early 20th century.

# Shanghai

The exhilarating metropolis of Shanghai was the first of China's cities to be influenced by the West. Today, its outstanding architectural landmarks along the famous Bund include the neoclassical Customs House and the China Merchants Bank building. Visit Old Shanghai's street markets and classical Chinese gardens, and tour the famous Shanghai Museum. The historic French Concession features distinctive European architecture, while 21st-century Pudong juxtaposes the ancient city. See the residences of Sun Yat-Sen and Zhou Enlai, two of 20th-century China's most famous leaders.



Stay in Shanghai's historic FAIRMONT PEACE HOTEL (pyramid-shaped roof) on the famous Bund, where elegant 19<sup>th</sup>-century architecture stands as a symbol to the city's legacy.



The Terra Cotta Warriors of Qin Shihuang®

In 1974, near the ancient city of Xi'an, farmers digging a well unearthed one of the most amazing archaeological discoveries of the 20th century—an army of thousands of life-size terra cotta warriors and

horses maintaining a silent vigil over the tomb of Emperor Qin Shihuang (259-210 B.C.). This visionary monarch, the first ruler of a unified China, introduced a standardized writing system, reformed the legal code and commenced the building of the Great Wall of China, the greatest public works project of its era. The emperor, as large a figure in death as he was in life, lies buried in a mausoleum that took 36 years to construct and required the efforts of 700,000 labourers. The tomb itself remains unexcavated, guarded by row upon row of charioteers, infantry, cavalry and horses. The face of each terra cotta warrior has a distinctive, lifelike expression, and each figure bears trappings denoting his rank within the imperial army—general, senior officer, junior officer or common soldier. In 1987, UNESCO designated this treasure trove of early Chinese art a World Heritage site.
